Why choose this qualification?

This qualification is unique because there are no mandatory units therefore making it flexible and adaptable to different groups of learners.

Thereare 39 optional units ranging from developing own skills and setting goals, to managing social relationships, parenting awareness, healthy living, budgeting, community action, environmental awareness to preparation for work. Learners must complete a minimum of 13 credits at Level 1.

Assessment methods

All units are internally assessed by a portfolio of evidence. Assessment is set, marked and internally quality assured by the centre to clearly demonstrate achievement of the learning outcomes. Work will be set to improve your practical skills, knowledge and understanding. For practical elements, learners will be observed by an assessor. All work must be collected in a portfolio of evidence and cross-referenced to requirements listed in the record of assessment book.

Funding (England)

This qualification is currently eligible for funding in England under the Adult Education Budget.
